Once you have a complete set of references, obtaining DOIs is extremely easy and quick. All you have to do is as follows:

- 1. Access the Simple Text Query (http://www.crossref.org/simpleTextQuery).
- 2. Enter your email address
- 3. Copy the whole reference list from our manuscript
- 4. Paste the whole reference list into the box below the text: "Enter text in the box below:"
- 5. Click on "Submit"
- 6. After a few seconds or up to a minute or so, you will have available DOI numbers for the references
- 7. Copy, one by one, the doi number of each journal article (but not books or other sources) and paste it at the end of the relevant journal article cited in our manuscript, only one space after the period at the end of the reference. Please note that the permanent link for the doi number should be removed. For example, if the Simple Text Query yields the following:

Teddlie, C., & Yu, F. (2007). Mixed methods sampling: A typology with examples. Journal of Mixed Methods Research, 1, 77-100. http://dx.doi.org/10.1177/2345678906292430

then, you should change permanent link (http://dx.doi.org/10.1177/2345678906292430) to the APA format for reporting doi numbers (i.e., doi:10.1177/2345678906292430). That is, you should change "http://dx.doi.org/" to "doi:"

Please note that the hyperlink should be removed. Also, there should be no space between the doi and the colon, or between the colon and the actual doi number (cf. APA, 2010, pp. 187-192).
